Barry Lee Rehus fell asleep in death on February 16, 2023 at the age of 75. Born in Findlay, Ohio to Robert and Margaret Rehus on April 5, 1947, the oldest of five children. He is preceded in death by both parents, whom he loved dearly.

Barry is survived by the love of his life, Betsy, his wife of 52 years. Together they have two children Kate Nest (husband Jeff) and Nathan Rehus (wife Carrie), along with five grandchildren, Savannah Leeb, Spencer Nest, Austin, Abigail, and Ezra Rehus.
